Global summit in Denmark to find new food solutions

Food VIPs, students and industry leaders gather in Denmark to find solutions to the global food challenge during the IFAMA world conference in June.

Denmark will play a key role in this drive, especially with regard to its innovative Food Cluster. I look forward to speaking on this topic at the upcoming IFAMA World Conference," says the EU Commissioner.

Other keynote speakers includes Mr. Peder Tuborgh, CEO of Arla Foods; and Mr. Flemming Besenbacher, Chairman of Carlsberg A/S and the Carlsberg Foundation.

The keynote speakers will also participate in panel debates alongside other notable personalities within the food sector, including representatives from global companies such as Olam, Nestlé, BASF, Bayer, Friesland Campina, Novus International, Keygene, Rabobank and many more.

3 major issues

The IFAMA world conference will focus on three major issues crucial to the food challenge:

- People: Flow of Talent in the Food and Agribusiness Sector
- Climate: Climate-Smart Food and Agribusiness Systems
- Big data: Better Analytics and Deeper Insight Management

These issues will be the topics for both industrial and political debates and round tables, scientific symposiums and a case competition for global top students.

The program for the IFAMA World Conference also consist of matchmaking opportunities for the agrifood sector, receptions, awards and site visits within the Danish Food Cluster, the worlds third largest food cluster.

For exhibitors the centrally located SAS Radisson Scandinavian Center creates the perfect backdrop for showcasing competences and networking with both the food talents of tomorrow and high level representatives within both industry, academia and policy.
