In July this year, CRU's Fertilizer Week reported that the Tanzania Petroleum Development Company (TPDC) said construction of a \$3 billion urea plant will begin in December 2016, according to local press reports. The plant will be built by a consortium including Haldor Topsoe (providing technology), Ferrostaal (providing EPC services), and Pakistani Fauji Fertilizers, which will operate the plant.

As outlined in the June 2016 edition of CRU's Urea Market Outlook, building a fertilizer plant in sub-Saharan Africa has been an area of interest for international market participants in recent years.
