Economic Transformation of Black Citrus Growers (ETBCG) Programme (Robert Miller)

The ETBCG programme was officially launched in April 2020 and has now reached the halfway stage in its three-year term. The programme has committed to provide funding to 30 farmers, to create 329 permanent jobs, 1397 permanent seasonal jobs and will provide 2006 skills development opportunities to citrus industry workers and people in surrounding communities. The programme also aims to significantly contribute to the further development and economic sustainability of black citrus growers in South Africa.

In order to accomplish this, the ETBCG programme funds orchard establishment, rehabilitation and improvements, production funding for new and replanted orchards, infrastructure projects (packhouses, irrigation and fencing), and skills development (learnerships, bursaries and skills programmes). The total value of the programme is R307 million, which is funded from various sources. The programme funders are the CGA, DALRRD, AgriSETA, First National Bank and the Jobs Fund (National Treasury). The CGA would like to thank all the funders for their contributions and commitment to the programme.

Funding is made available to beneficiaries as a combination of grant and loan funding. The loan portion is offered on favourable terms to qualifying growers. In order to qualify for funding, applicants have to meet the following criteria: at least 50% black-owned as defined by the B-BBEE Act of 2013, appropriate operational and management structures are in place, the business is commercially viable, financially sustainable and actively involved in commercial citrus production, and both permanent and permanent seasonal jobs will be created through the funding. Applications must also meet FNB transformation loan funding requirements. Technical assessments are conducted on all applications, that address security of tender, water, environmental and food safety matters.

Since the start of the project, 17 applications have been received and are in various stages of the approval process. As the goal of the project is to assist 30 farmers, further applications for funding from the project are encouraged.
