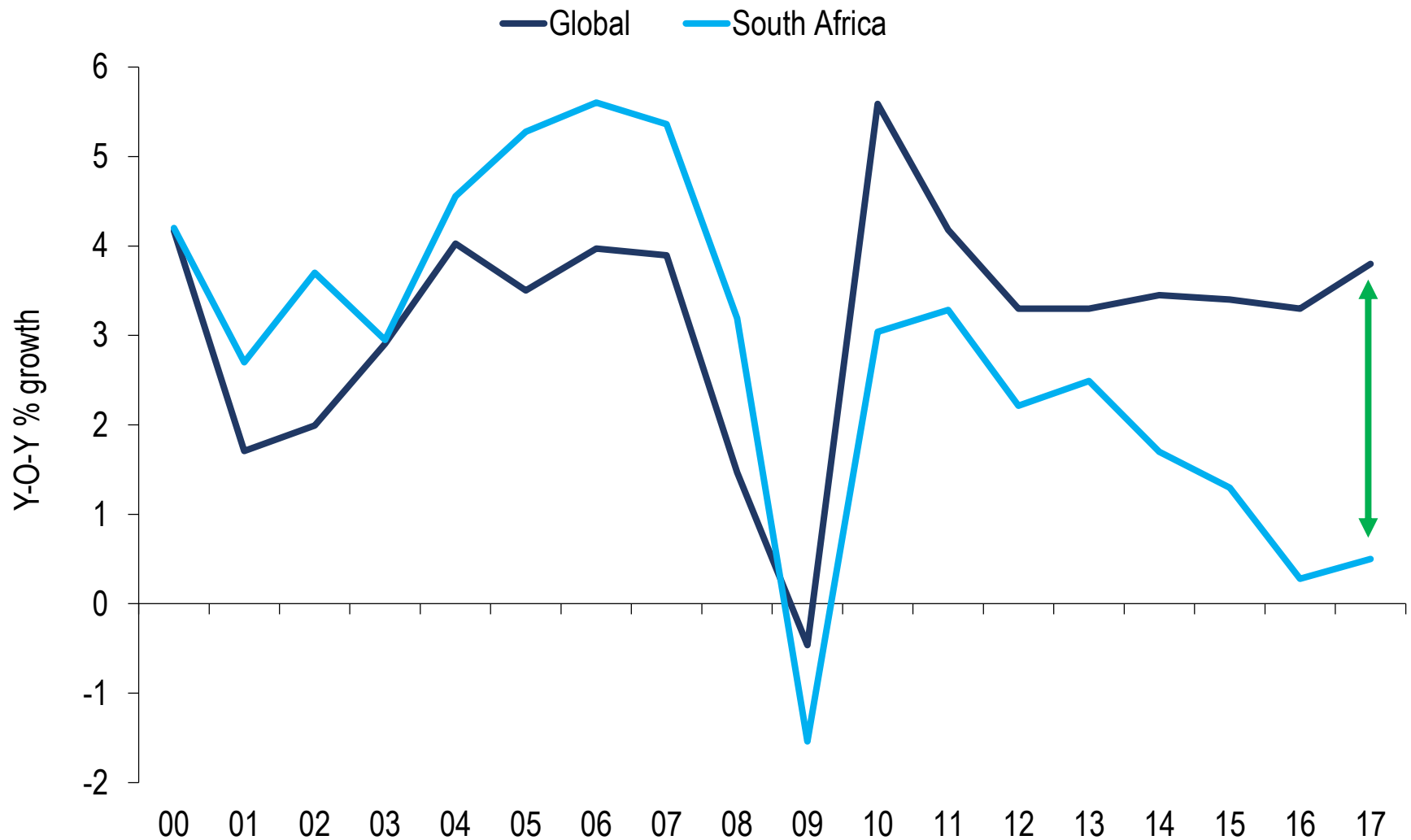

Why is business confidence important?...

“Improved business confidence is the cheapest form of economic stimulus”

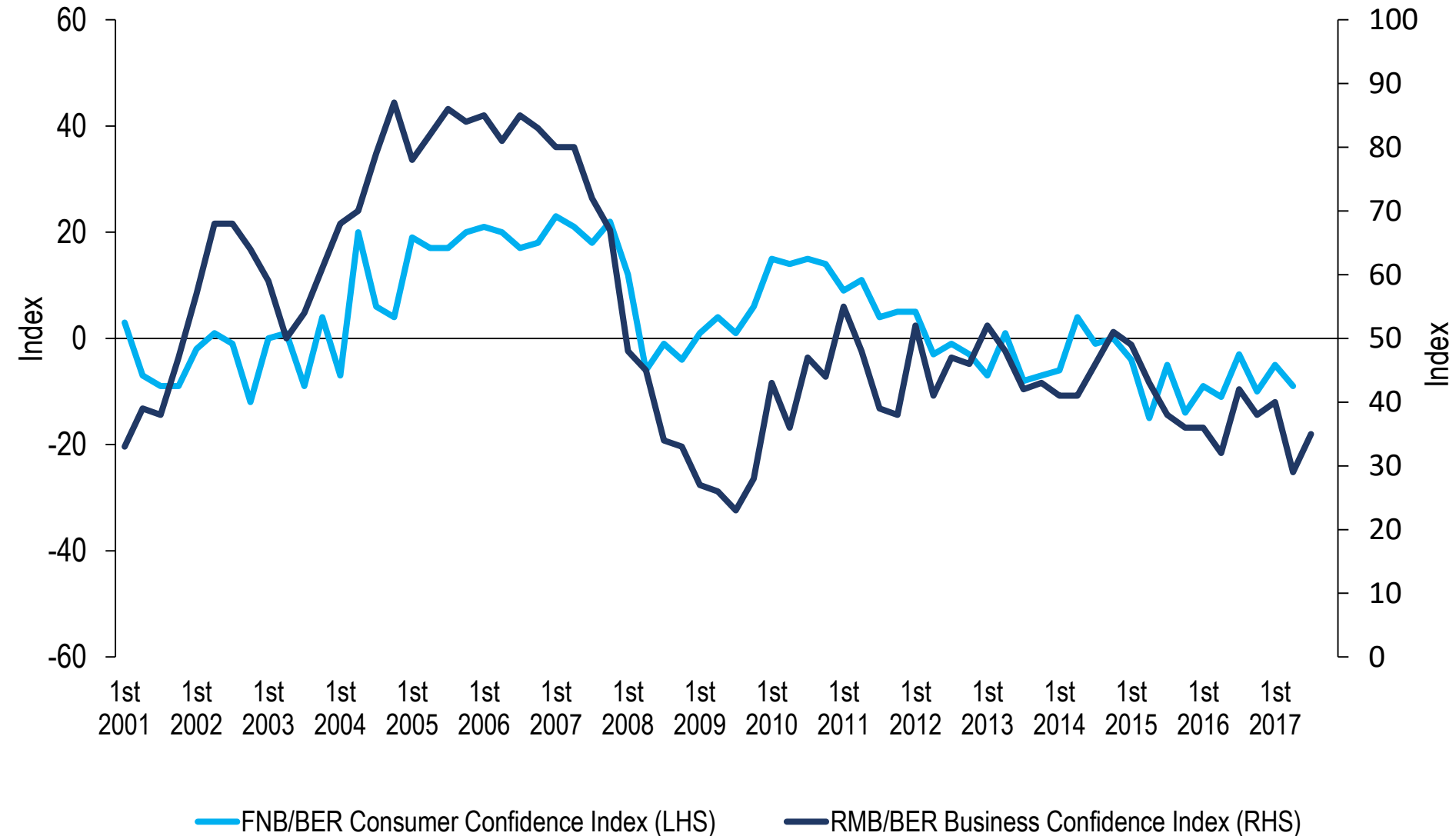

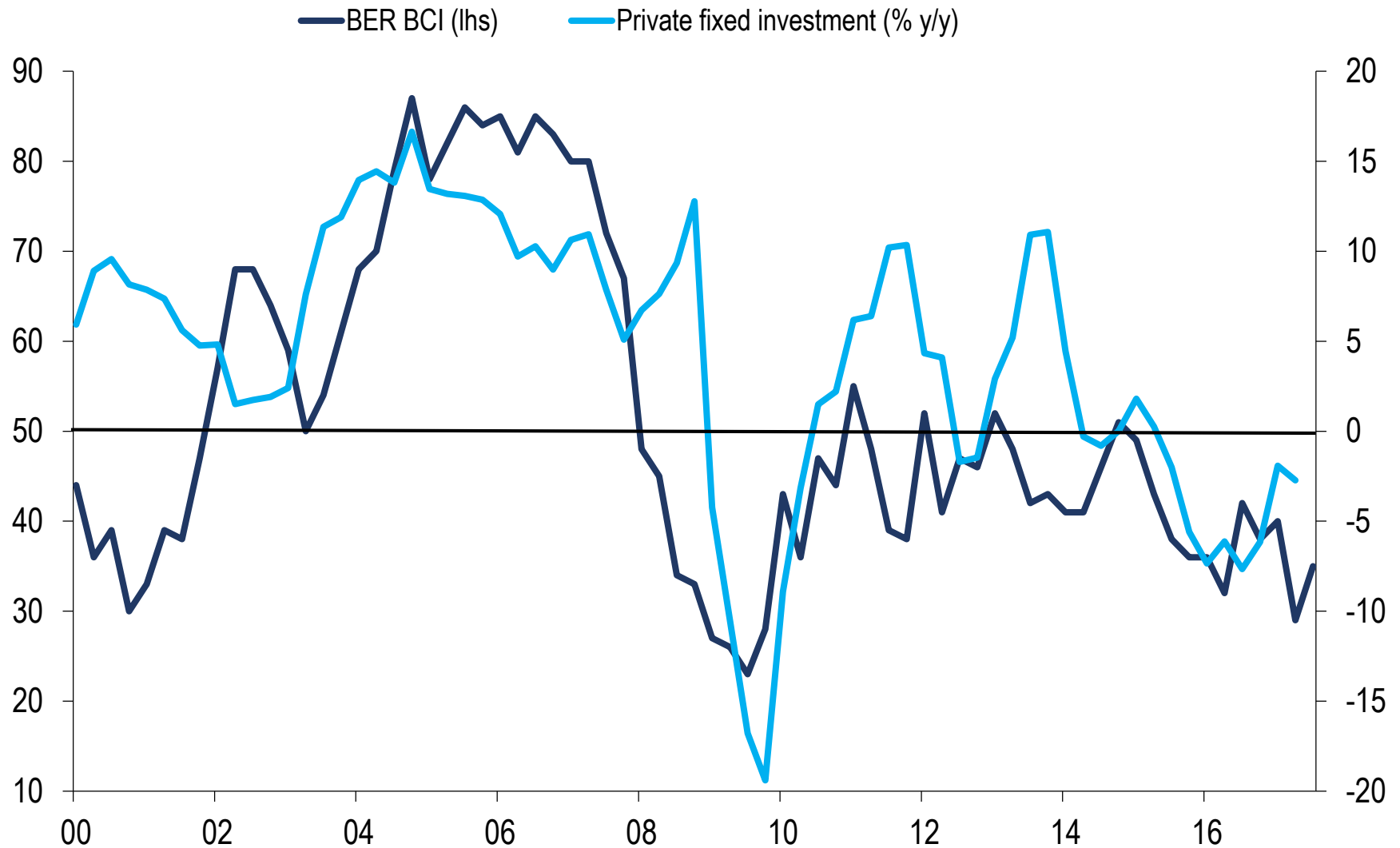

SA business and consumer confidence remain depressed...



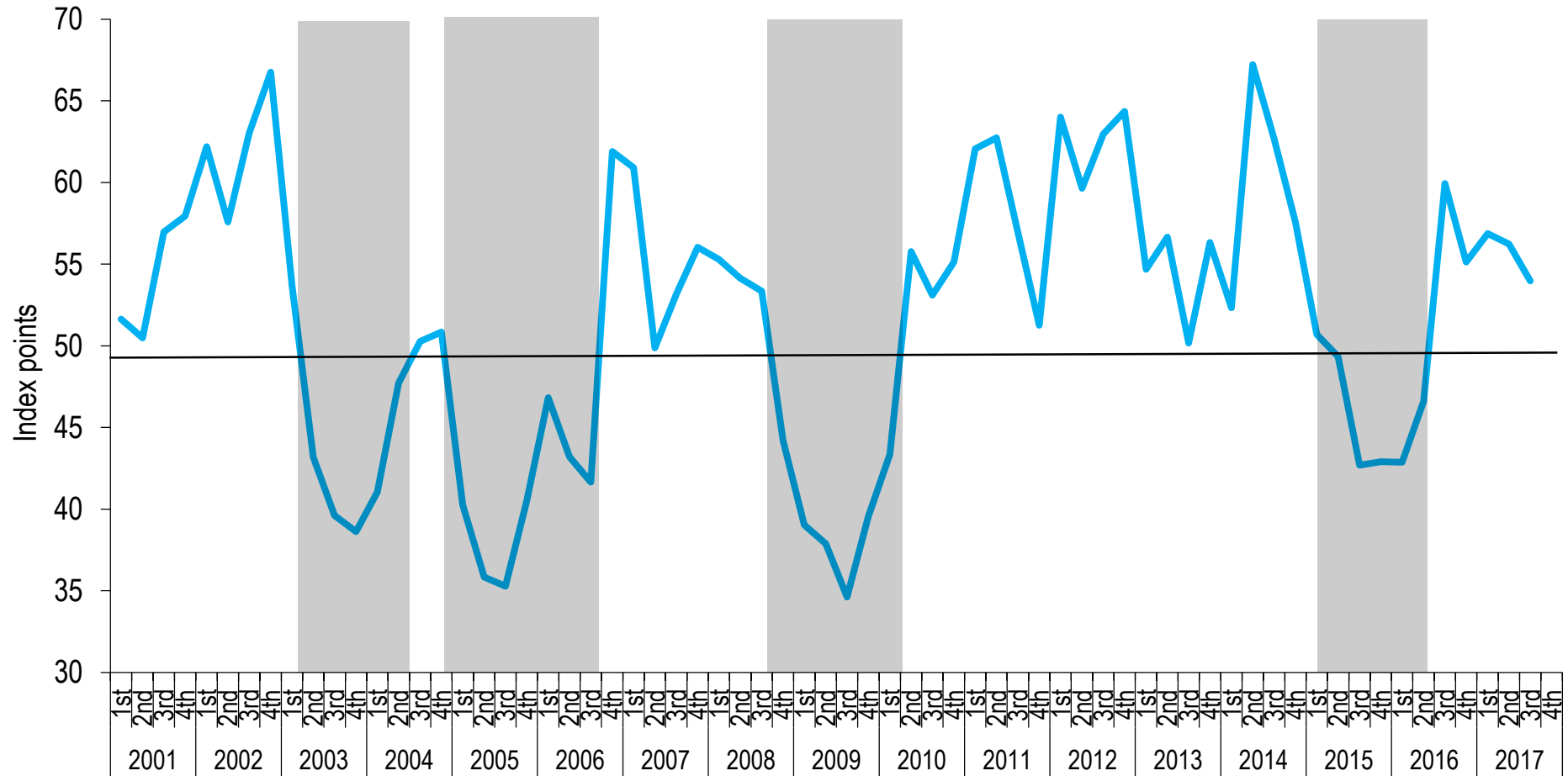

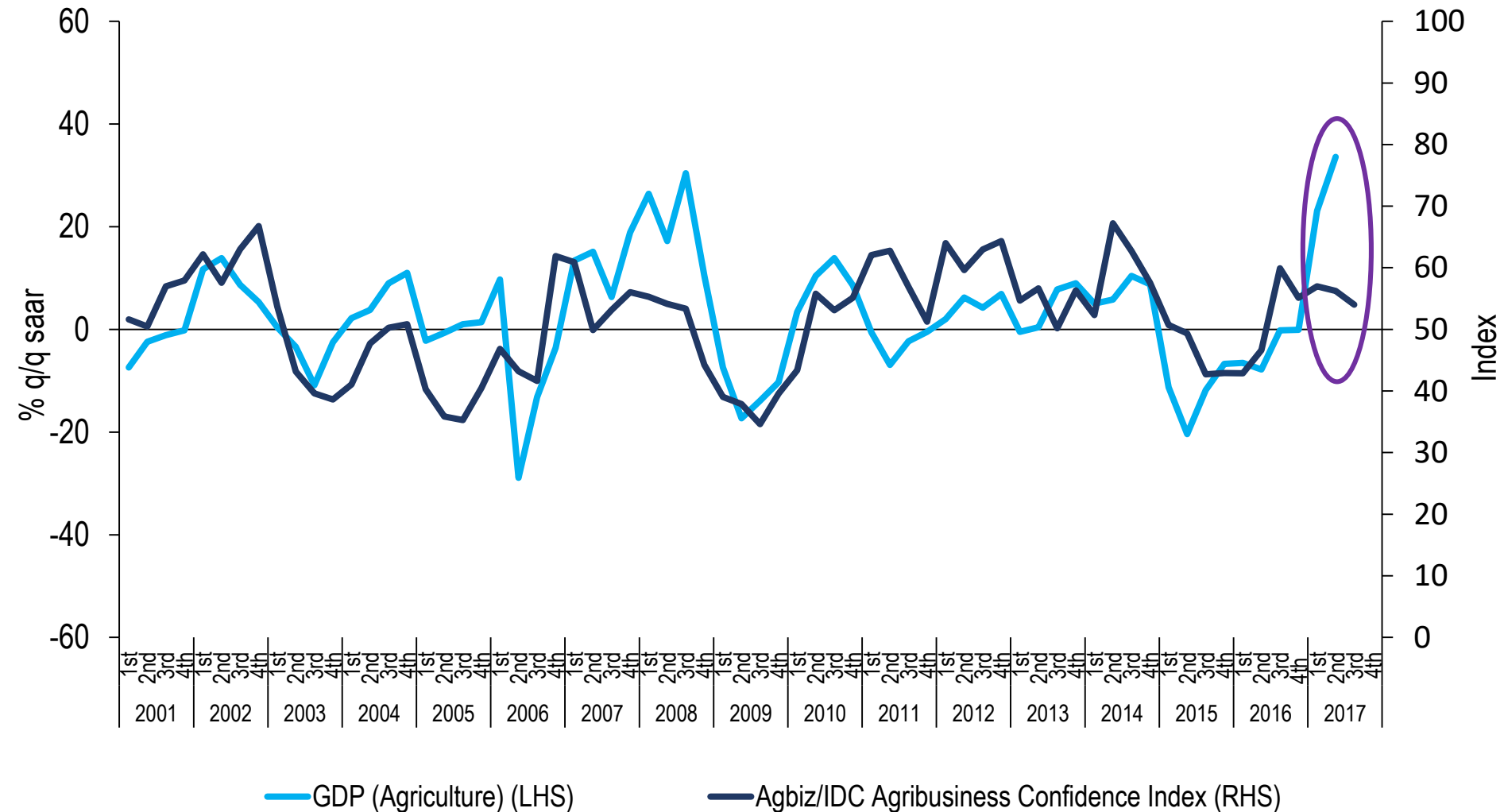
Although still in an expansionary terrain, Agribusinesses' Confidence is also on a declining trend...

Agbiz/IDC Agribusiness Confidence has proven to be good directional indicator for agri. GDP growth (but now?)...

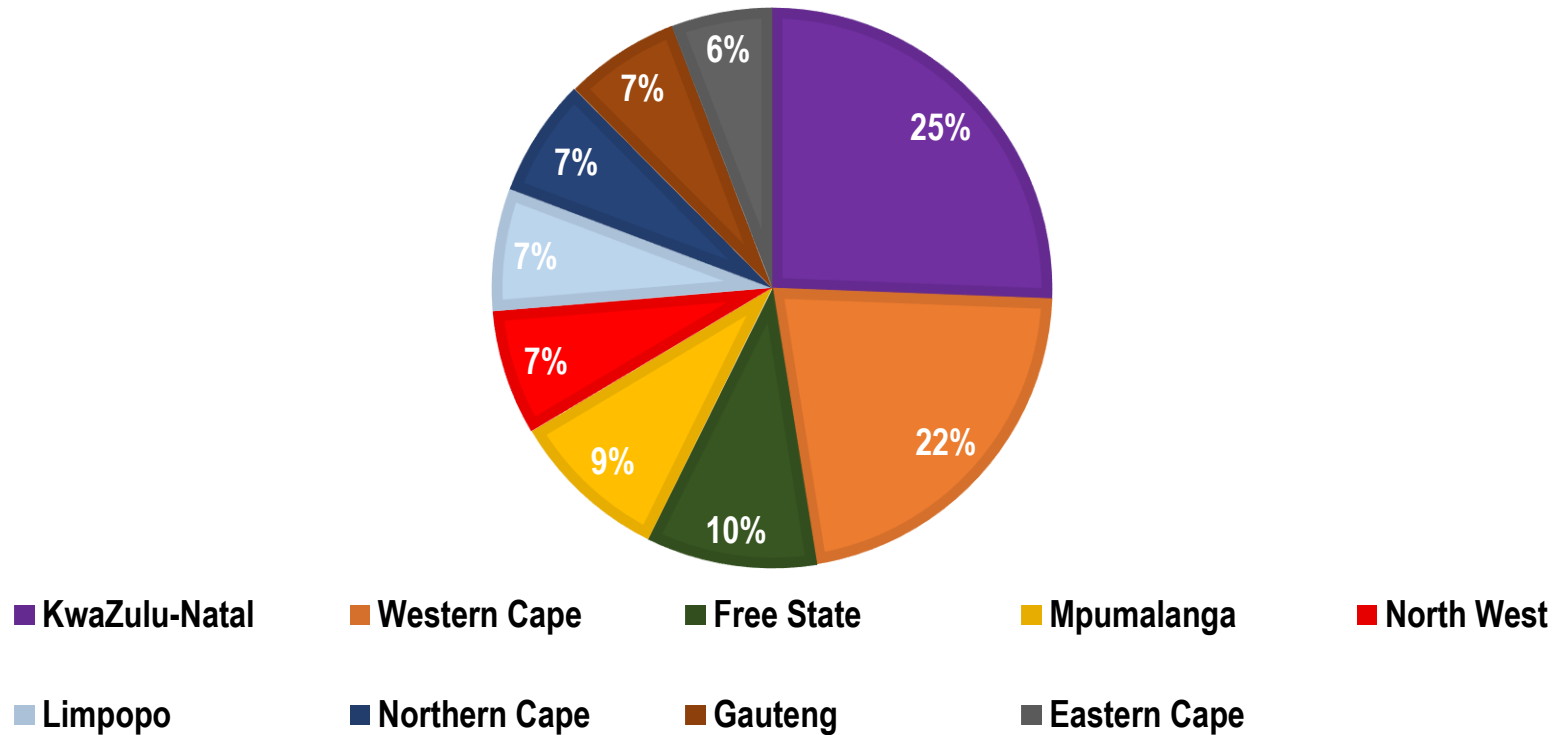

Agbiz/IDC Agribusiness Confidence has proven to be good directional indicator for agri. GDP growth (but now?)...

- The shift between the “emotional side of agriculture and hard data” can partly be explained by policy uncertainty, particularly Land Reform ahead of the ANC conference...
- The survey respondents from the WC region were also pessimistic due to persistent dryness – this too partly explains the shift between confidence and agricultural GDP growth...
- Implications going forward?

The Western Cape province is a key contributor to the country's agricultural economy, but...implications of dryness could be delayed....

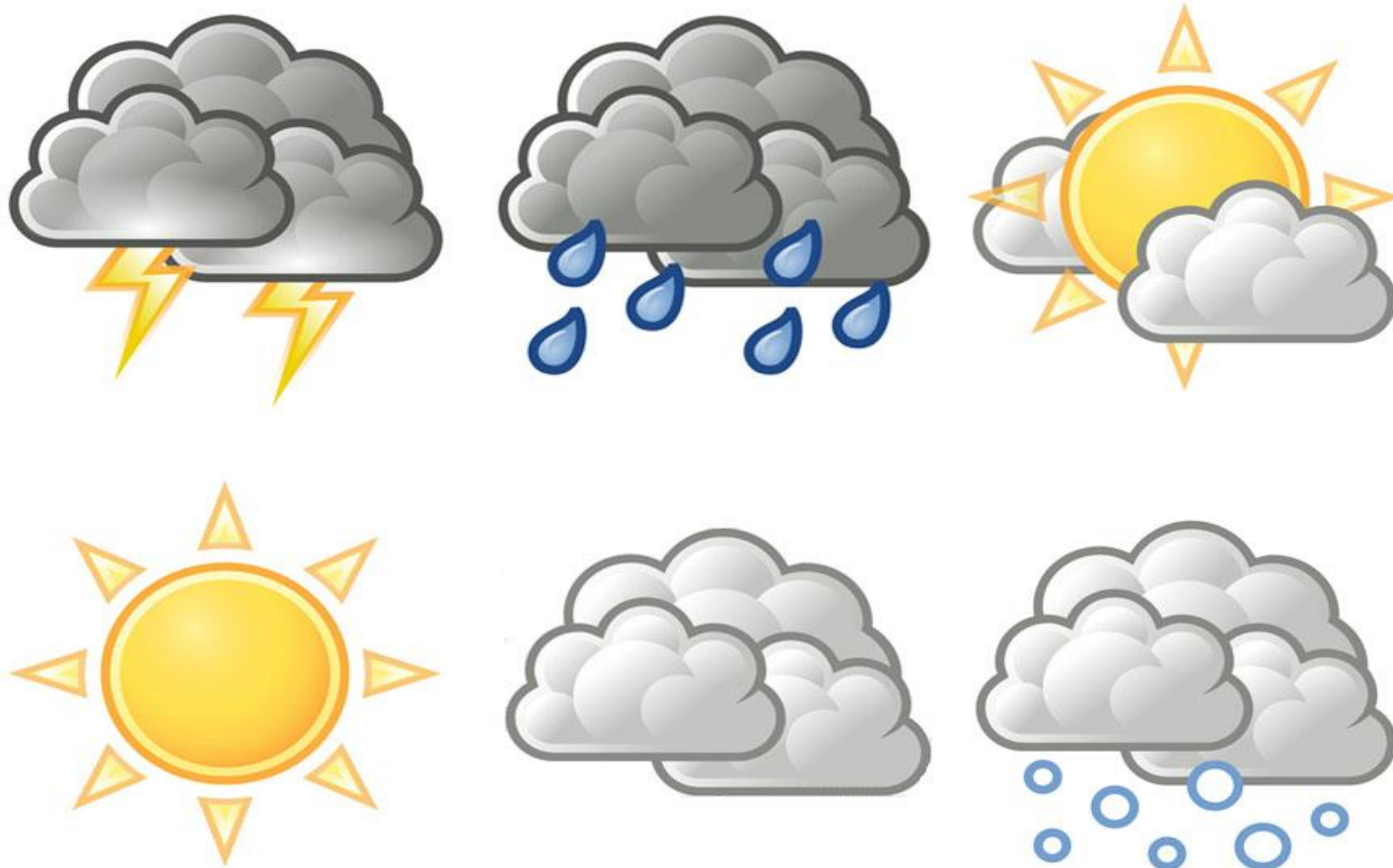

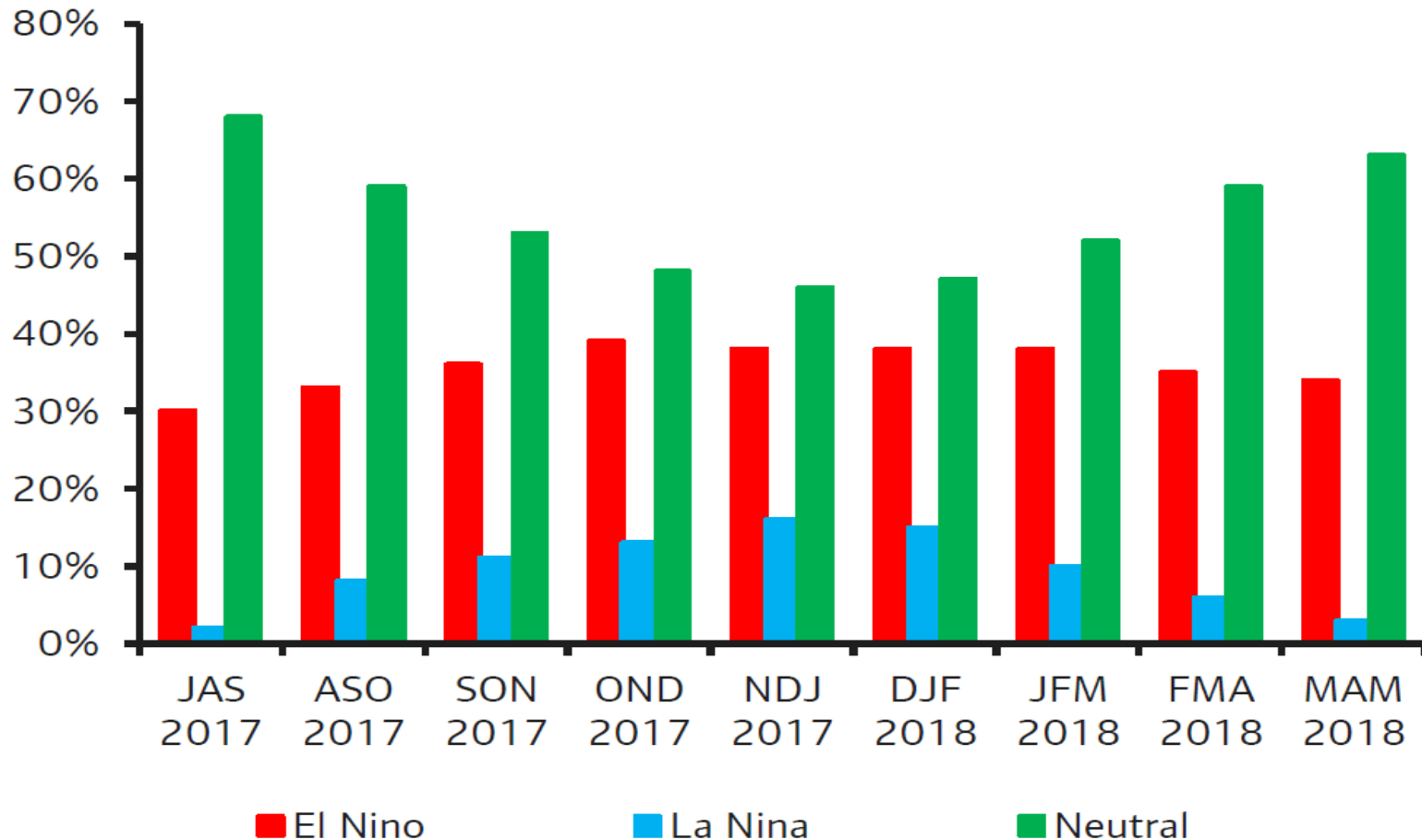

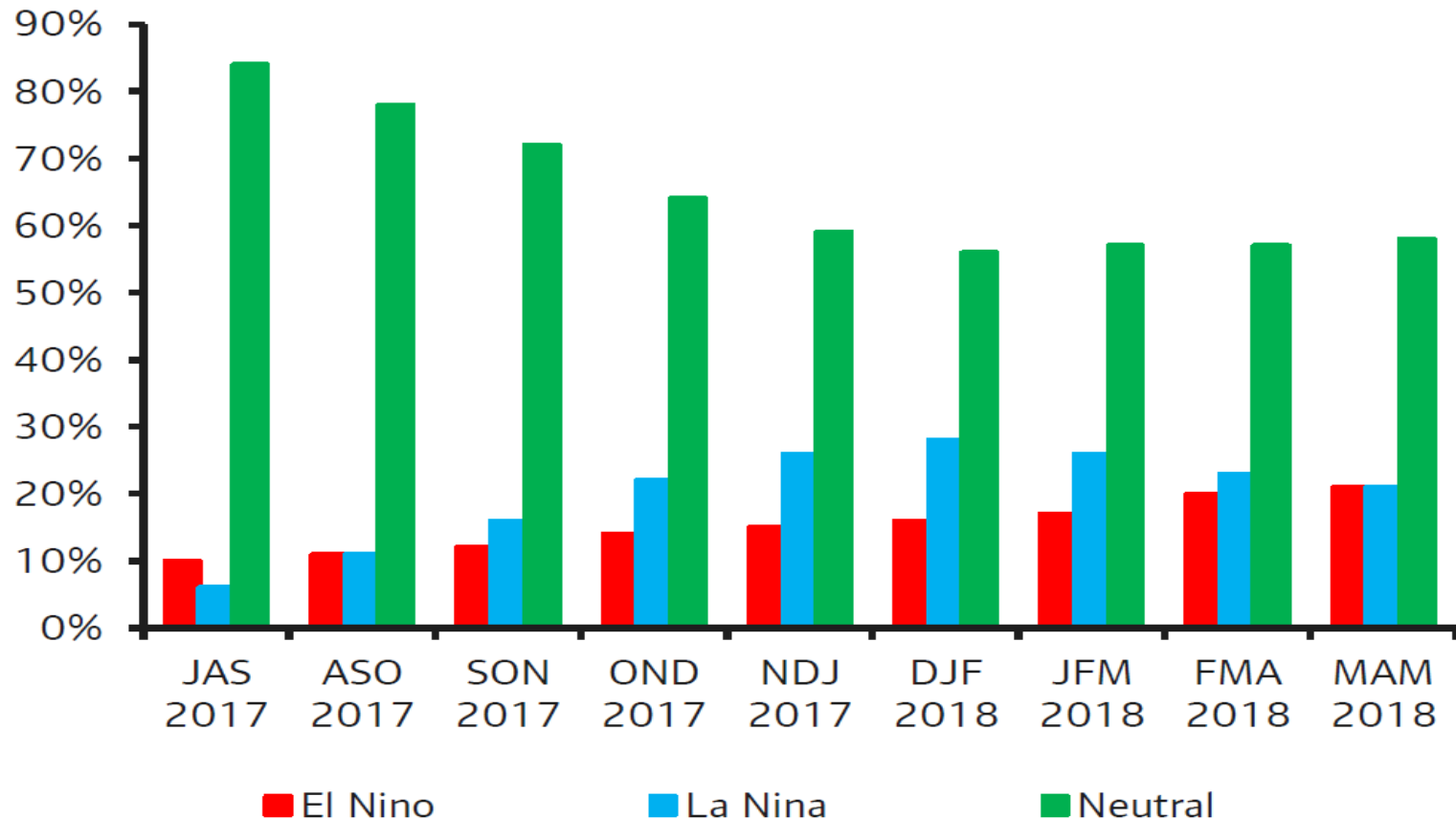
Apart from policy matters, weather remains a primary driver of agribusiness confidence and growth in agriculture – *general agricultural conditions sub-index...*

October 2017 to February 2018

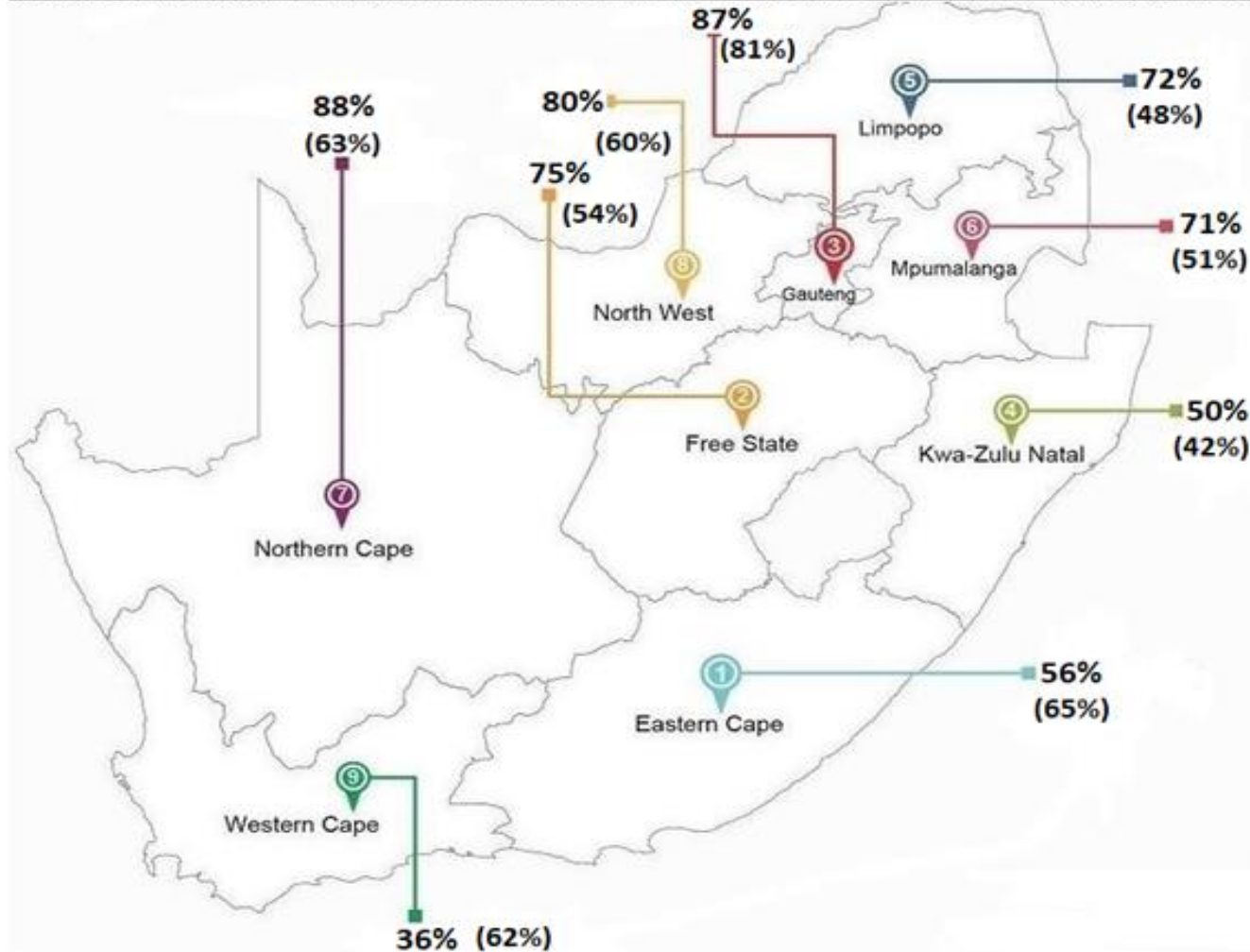

I. Overview

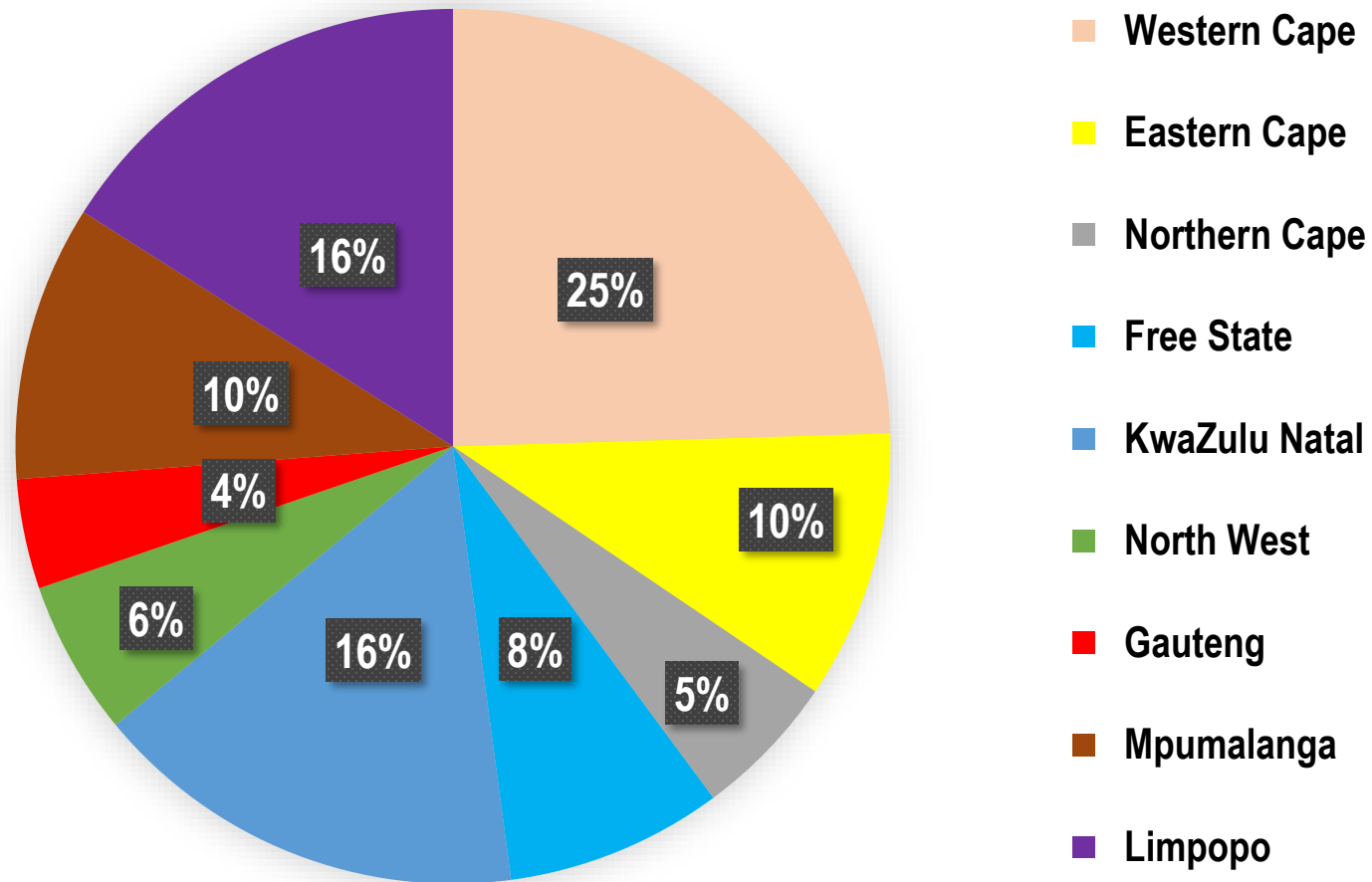
During the last month there has been a drastic change in the expected El Niño Southern Oscillation (ENSO) phase. The current predictions now indicate a high likelihood for a weak La Niña to develop during the early and mid-summer months (Nov-Dec-Jan and Dec-Jan-Feb). This, supported by the regional forecasts, indicates that the summer rainfall areas (north-eastern parts of South Africa) can expect above-normal rainfall during these periods. However regional forecasts as well as conditions over the Indian Ocean suggests that the late spring period (Oct-Nov-Dec) may receive below-normal rainfall in parts of the summer rainfall areas.

Unfortunately, the WC remains dry with lower water levels....

South Africa's average dam Levels: week ended 25 September 2017 (last year's figures in brackets – 25 September 2016)

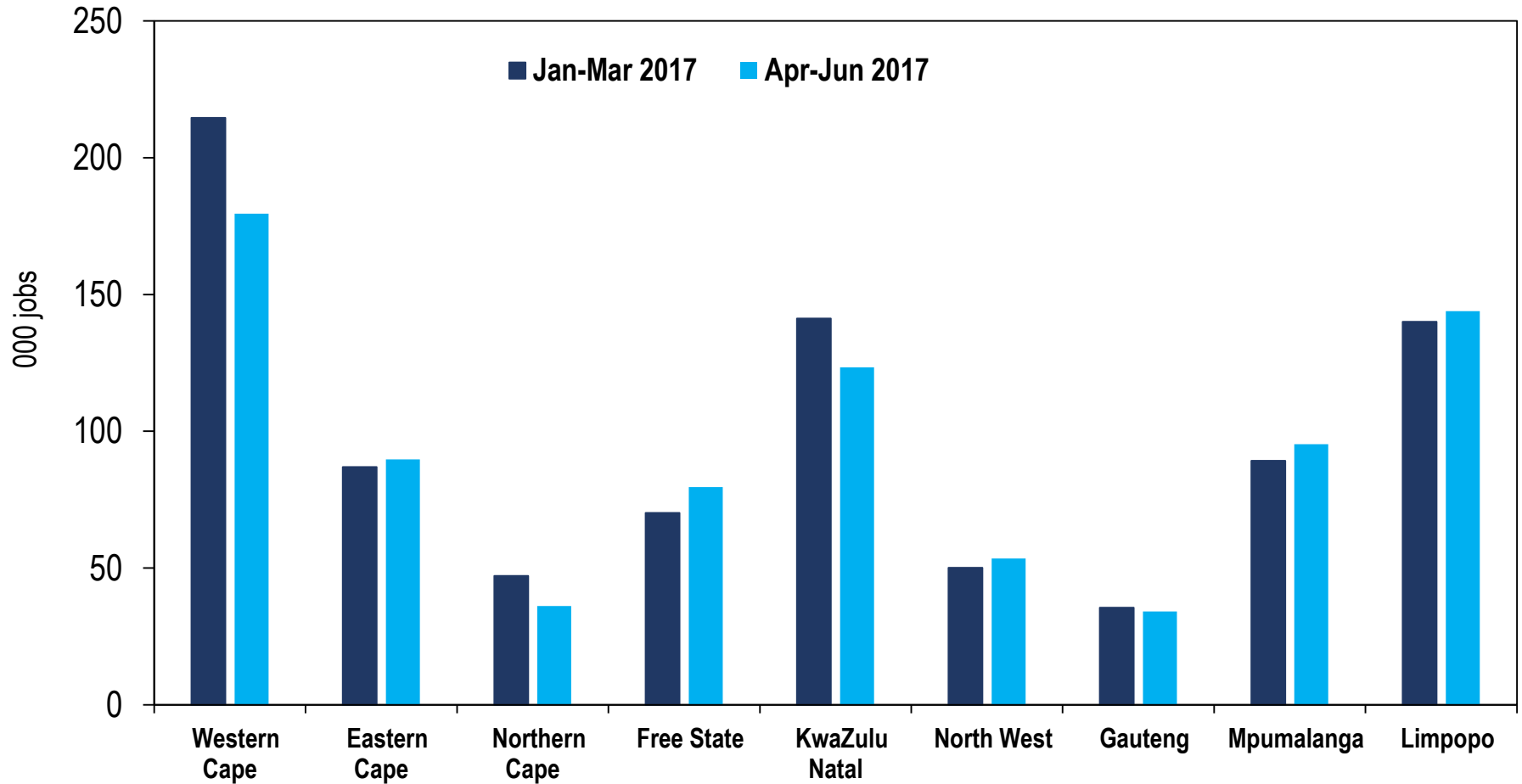


Apart from a growth story, drought in the WC could also negatively affect the agricultural labour market...

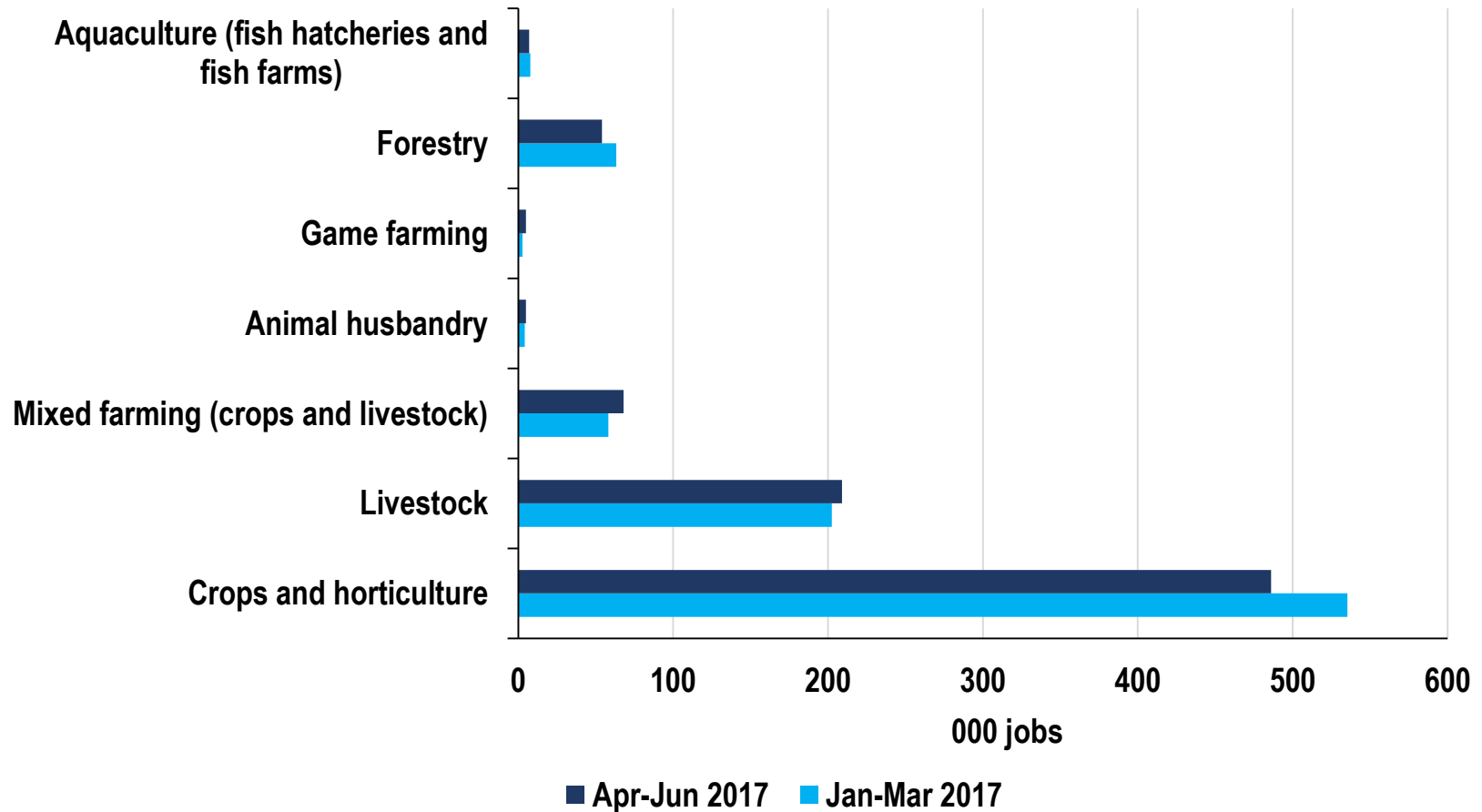

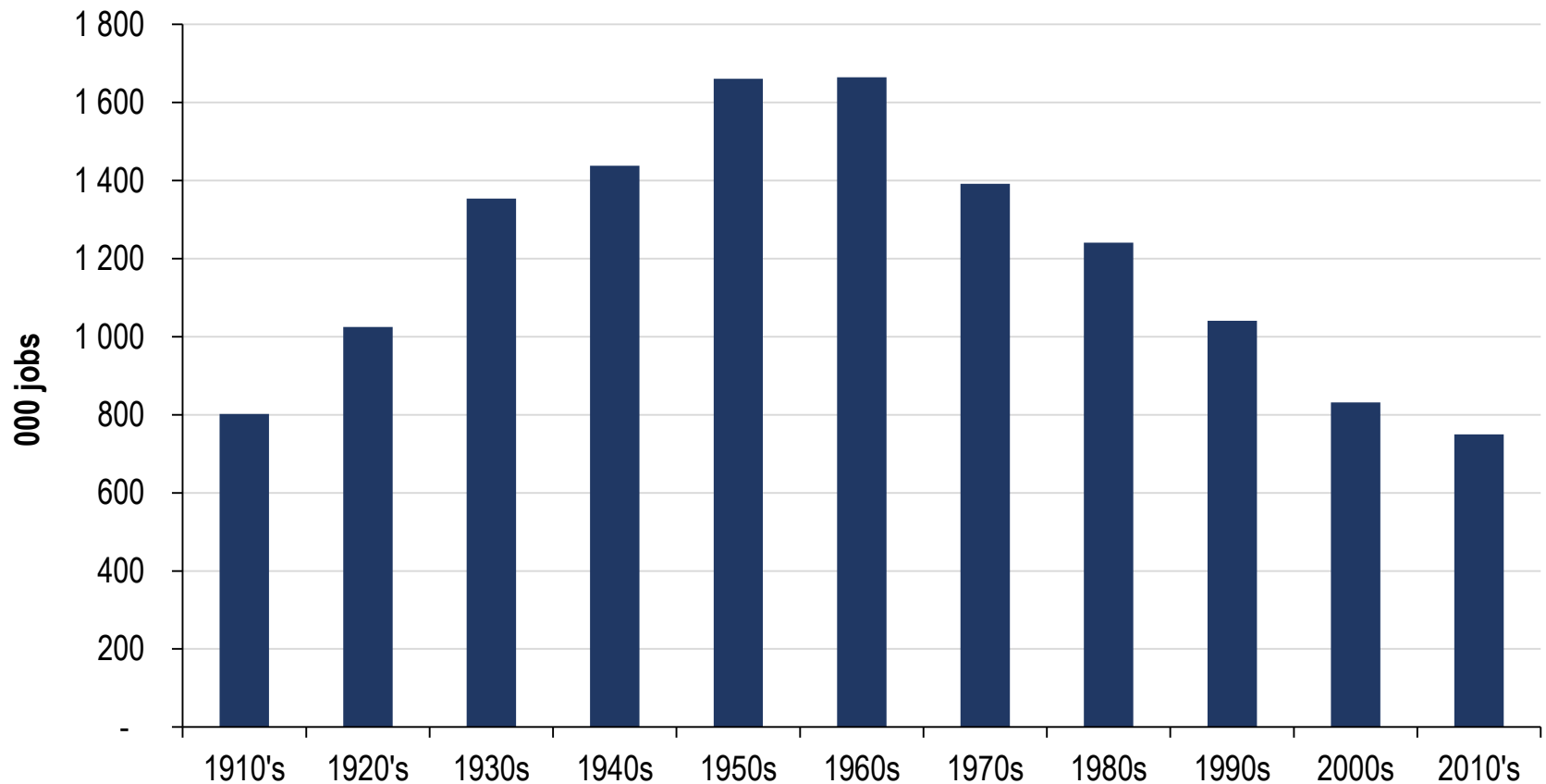
Apart from a growth story, drought in the WC could also negatively affect the agricultural labour market...



Negative impact will most likely be in field crops, horticulture and forestry...



This could drift SA away from its goal of creating close to a million jobs in the sector by 2030 (NDP) – a tough target given that jobs have only been at such levels in the 1960's...

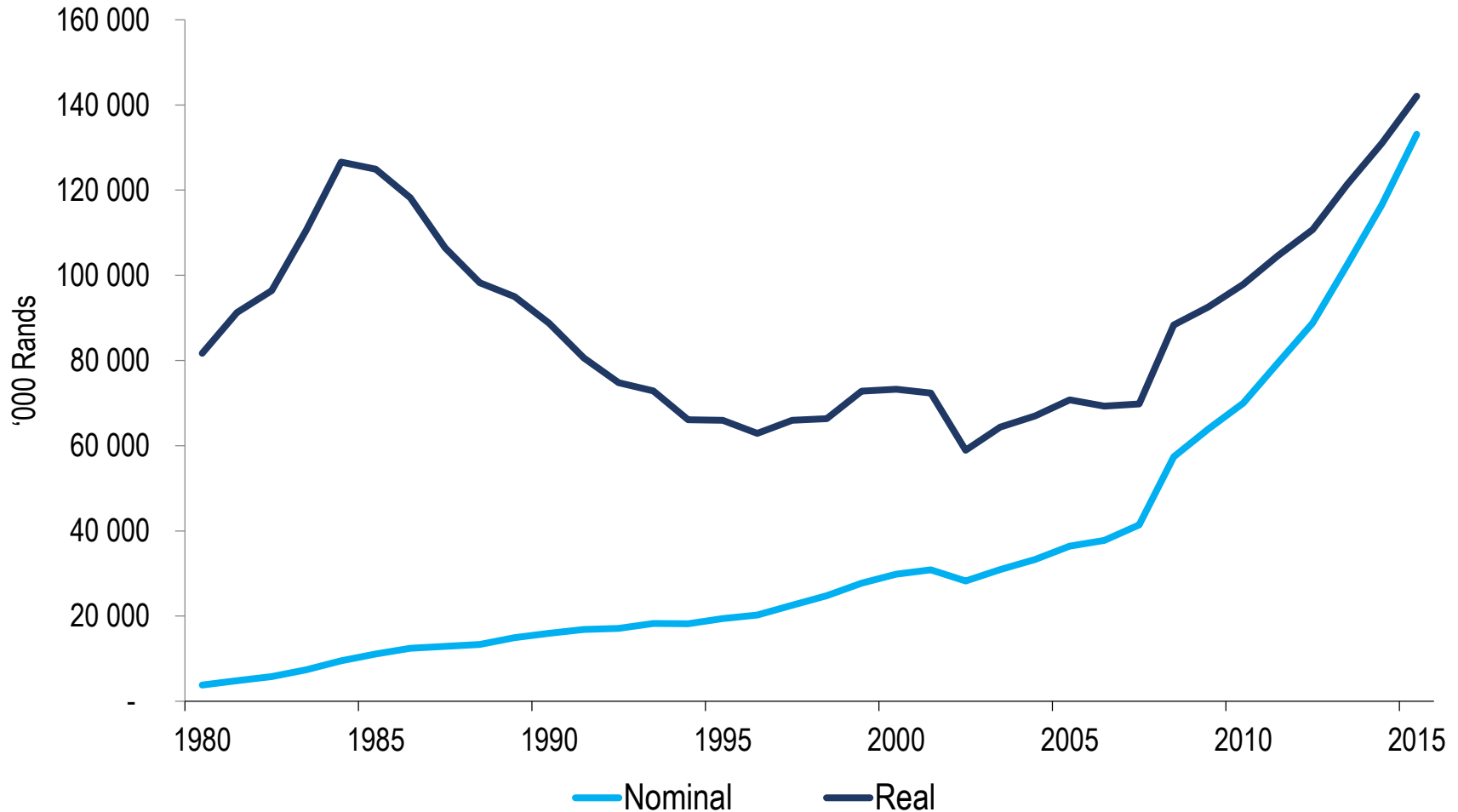


Key takeaways - confidence and growth in SA agricultural sector...

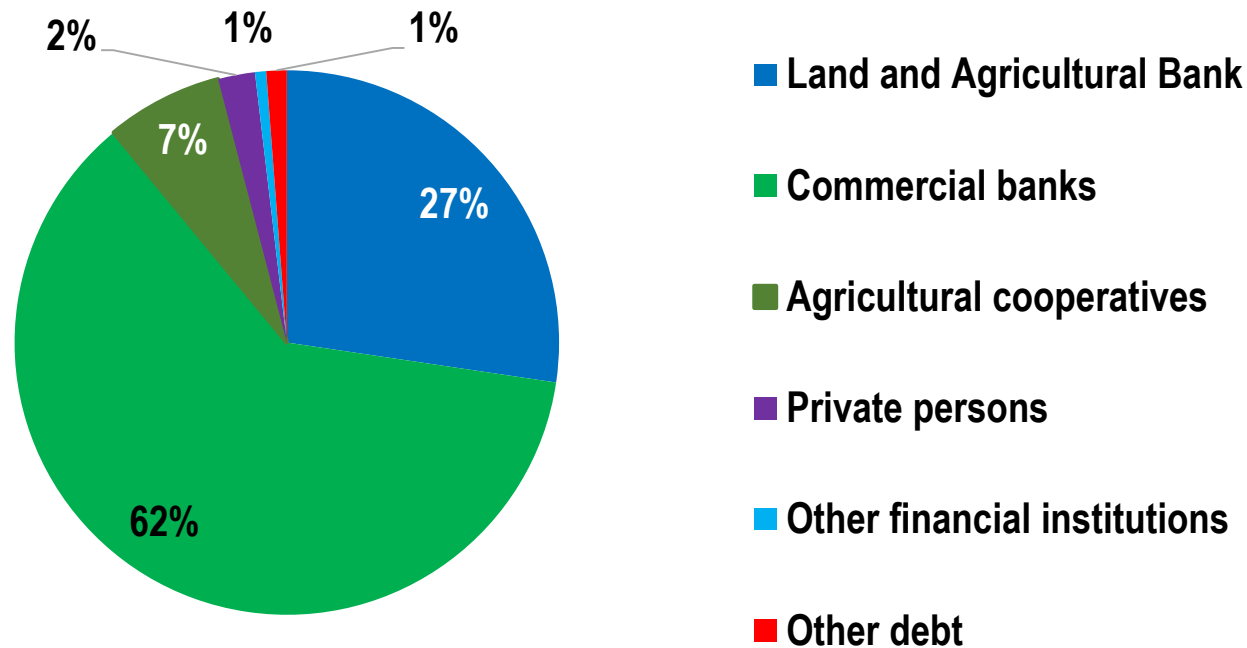
- Policy *uncertainty* will remain a key theme ahead of December 2017 ruling party's conference...
- The weather forecasts paint a **positive** picture for the upcoming season -- good for summer crops (*but winter crop growing areas will remain stressed*)...
- In the short term, the agricultural sector will remain on a positive growth path. The effects of the WC drought will be clear in 2018's growth (GDP) numbers...

*On balance – the policy environment is quite uncertain, but **Agbiz** will continue to engage policy makers in order ensure sustainability of the agricultural sector...*

Farm debt: Land reform developments not only impact farmers, but agribusinesses and financial institutions as well...



Risk to Collateral: Land reform, particularly the talks of “expropriation without compensation” (this chart shows SA agricultural farm debt)...
