AN INVITATION TO ATTEND THE NATIONAL & PROVINCIAL PUBLIC HEARINGS ON THE NATIONAL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT PLAN (NSDP) AND PROPOSED SETA LANDSCAPE

The National Skills Authority (NSA) invites skills development stakeholders from Quality Councils, SETAs, Government, Business, Labour, Education and Training Providers, Community Constituencies, Provincial Skills Development Forums (PSDFs), Research Institutions, Professional Bodies and the general public to attend public hearings on the NSDS and SETA landscape beyond 2020 (Re-establishment of SETAs).

The NSA is a statutory advisory body established in 1999 in terms of Chapter 2 of the Skills Development Act (SDA) No 97 of 1998. The primary function of the NSA is to advise the Minister of Higher Education and Training on matters of skills development in accordance with section 5 of the Skills Development Act.

The NSA will be hosting National public hearings as follows:

Date : 25 -28 September 2018

Venue : Destiny Hotel and Convention Centre, Kempton Park

And

Provincial public hearings will be held as follows:

Date : 25 -28 September 2018

Venue : All nine provinces (1 day per province)

NB: A date and venue for each province will be communicated via the Provincial Skills Development Forums (PSDFs) and the NSA website before 5 September 2018.

The objective of the public hearings is:

- To solicit inputs/recommendations on the NSDP and SETA Landscape beyond 2020.

All the hearings will be starting at 09:00-17:00. The discussion documents can be accessed on the NSA website on www.nationalskillsauthority.org.za.

Written submissions are invited from all other interested Individuals and organisations.
