Pork producers launch #YesMrPresident Campaign

The South African Pork Producers' Organisation (SAPPO) launched its digital Facebook #YesMrPresident Campaign today.

"SAPPO believes that South Africa's leaders are facing a daunting task to navigate the nation during the Covid-19 pandemic and with our #YesMrPresident Campaign we want to demonstrate our solidarity with President Cyril Ramaphosa and his colleagues," says Johann Kotzé, CEO of SAPPO.

Kotzé says that although the campaign was initially aimed at farmers transporting workers, working their lands, people producing products in factories and processing food and people distributing products, those in other industries and even individuals at home are welcome to participate.
