
From the FPEF's side we are involved in the development of moving away from paper-based export documentation. One such example is **TITAN 2.0** which has reached a milestone of capturing 1 million cartons on 27 August since its inception in November 2019. Some benefits of TITAN 2.0 are: real time information, electronic certification for export, integration with the Tracking Unit Register (TUR) and clients can apply for electronic phyto-sanitary certificates via the ePhyto platform.

As the FPEF is the official **fresh produce Export Council** registered with the dtic, we are closely involved in some of the activities and initiatives of the department. The latest was the launch of the **Export Barriers Monitoring Mechanism** (EBMM) on Monday 31 August. We provided information to the relevant presenters and thus our industry has received considerable exposure. The main objective of this initiative is to provide a single entity through which the barrier can be managed - both within South Africa and internationally. Any matter that is limiting an exporter to competitively export can be reported. The FPEF will report issues of which we are aware and which you inform us about, but individual exporters and other entities involved in the supply chain, can also report it individually at: <a href="mailto:ExportBarriers@thedtic.gov.za">ExportBarriers@thedtic.gov.za</a>. The mechanism also gives the FPEF, as Export Council, the opportunity to improve our monitoring of the export environment.

## **KOREA**

Interim measures to the pre-clearance program of Citrus fruits (Orange, Lemon and Grapefruit) produced in the Republic of South Africa for the Republic of Korea, has been reviewed. Citrus exports from South Africa may continue, as these interim measures will be extended for September and South Korea will accept the phytosanitary certificates of South Africa issued by 30 September.

## STRENGTHENING OF THE FMS SYSTEM FOR EXPORTS TO THE EU



The following temporary measure, to prevent further FCM interceptions in the EU in 2020, will apply as of 01 September 2020 for the remainder of the

For the export of oranges (*Citrus sinensis*) to the EU in Reefer Containers, as of 01 September 2020, PPECB will only allow exporters to make a booking for such exports under shipping regime codes as specified under Option C in the Citrus FMS. FMS Category A oranges will also be allowed to be shipped under shipping regime code ECWO out of the Cape Town port.

The additional measure applies only to oranges shipped in containers. Requirements for other citrus types and specialised reefer vessel (conventional) shipments remain unchanged. Where other citrus types are combined with oranges in a mixed consignment, the temporary measure will apply to the consignment in accordance with the principle of the lowest common denominator.

### SATI/FPEF COVID-19 TASKTEAM

#### **B4SA NOTES ANNOUNCEMENT OF RESUMPTION OF UIF TERS PAYMENTS**

Business for South Africa (B4SA) notes the announcement by the Unemployment Insurance Fund (UIF) that Temporary Employer/Employee Relief Scheme (TERS) benefits are to resume following a halting of payments due to investigations into system integrity problems.

"The move is greeted with relief, though it is still unclear why it was necessary to bring the entire system to a standstill for several days," says B4SA Labour Workstream chair Robert Legh.
